At that time, young Asian American women lived in different areas of Silicon Valley with their families. Chi Am Circle served as a vehicle to bring them together once a month. The club started with arts and crafts, but gradually evolved into sponsoring and supporting many educational and cultural activities.

Chi Am's signature commitment to education has been its scholarship award program. Every year for over 30 years, Chi Am has provided scholarships for graduating high school seniors.

Chi Am members are leaders in the community. In recent years, Chi Am has expanded its community service to include supporting the efforts of other organizations.
